


Scriptures (Scripture Verses are NSRV unless otherwise stated)

The Old Testament Lessons

Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

It is often pointed out that the Hebrew word for "Spirit" is ruach, which is a feminine noun. Here in Proverbs, we hear the voice of God's wisdom, which is also feminine. She raises her voice and takes her stand. Furthermore, she is identified with the work of creation, no doubt echoing the spirit that moved over the waters.

- ¹Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?
- ²On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand;
- ³beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out:
- ⁴"To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live.
- ²²The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- ²³Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- ²⁴When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.
- ²⁵Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—
- ²⁶when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.
- ²⁷When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,
- ²⁸when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep,
- ²⁹when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth,
 - ³⁰then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always,
- ³¹rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race."



The Responsive Reading of the Psalms

Psalm 8

The psalm for today serves as a meditation on the majesty of God, who is both transcendent yet whose presence is all around, evidenced in God's creative and providential power. All creation points to the majesty of God – the heavens, the stars, all life, and human beings can only marvel at this God whose majesty is beyond all telling.

- ¹O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!—
- ²you whose glory is chanted above the heavens out of the mouths of infants and children; you have set up a fortress against your enemies, to silence the foe and avenger.
- ³When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars you have set in their courses,
- ⁴what are mere mortals that you should be mindful of them, human beings that you should care for them?
- ⁵Yet you have made them little less than divine; with glory and honor you crown them.
- ⁶You have made them rule over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet:
- ⁷all flocks and cattle, even the wild beasts of the field,
- 8the birds of the air, the fish of the sea, and whatever passes along the paths of the sea.
- ⁹O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

The Epistle Reading

Romans 5:1-5

In this famous passage from Romans, Paul points us to the reality of faith lived in the world. We are both drawn close to the transcendent God, through being justified through faith, and compelled to live in the world whatever challenges might befall us.

¹Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

C: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel Lesson

John 16:12-15

A promise of an advocate, not bound by space and time, and who will teach, guide, and lead Jesus' followers is recorded in this text. This Advocate, or Spirit, is our mentor, teaching us to take up our role as disciples.

LA: May the God of creation's mysteries be with you.

C: May our hearts be transformed by our Brother, Jesus.

LA: May the Spirit of Life be with you.

C: We rejoice, singing the praise placed in our hearts.

LA: Our greatest joy is to offer you our thanks and praise,

Creator, Grace-giver, Healer of our brokenness.

All that is beautiful was created for our eyes;

all that is wonderful was created for our awe;

all that is majestic was created for our praise;

Believing life is about our appetites, we choose the bread of the world not the bread of life; knowing our only hope is from you, we continue to rebel; called to live in unity with one another, we cling to all which divides us.

Yet you refuse to let go of us, sending your only Son, Jesus, to call us to life in you. We have fallen, and you lift us up; we have forsaken you, and you redeem us; we are broken, and you make us whole.

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices, here and now, with the faithful of every time and place, singing to the glory of your name:

P: It is Jesus, God incarnate, the Risen Christ, who joins us together as a community of broken but hopeful believers: loving what he loved living what he taught, and striving to be his faithful servants in our time and place.

In this meal we remember Jesus, his promises, and the price he paid for who he was, what he said, and what he did for us.

On the night before Jesus died, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and said, "Take and eat; whenever you do this, remember me."

After supper, Jesus took the cup, and poured, saying, "This is the new covenant, whenever you drink of it, remember me." We do remember. We remember his life of love, his friendship, his teaching, his dying, and his rising to life again.

In sharing this meal, we live out the mystery of our faith:

C: Dying, Christ was our salvation; Rising, Christ is our new life; Returning, Christ is to come to bring us home.

P: Holy Mystery, God the Spirit, we call on you to transform these familiar things, as you continually transform the world around us.

Bless this bread and this cup, the wheat and the grape, the farmer and the harvest, the seed and the sower.

So that in the sharing of these simple elements in community, we may taste and see your goodness, so that we might catch a glimpse of what it is to be in communion with you and with one another.

Through Christ, in Christ, and with Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever.
