

- LA: Let us pray together, saying:
- C: God of joy, repentance, and comfort, we need you today. As we continue to celebrate the good news of the Resurrection, we remember times when it was hard news to believe. As we come and worship you this day, may we leave our doubts and fears with you and enter into a time of joy. May we see your love come to life in all we do today. Amen.

*Invitation to Confession

- P: If our actions mirrored our words, if our hands were mentored by our hearts, if we walked the talk - we would be God's children. But too often, it is our silence, our doubts, our fears which tell others who we truly are. Let us confess to God how we have not been as faithful as we hope, as we pray, saying,
- C: God of empty tombs: Peter speaks with power and clarity of his faith, while we remain silent. The psalmist speaks of trusting in you, while our doubts overwhelm us. Jesus is read to come and grace us with peace, but our fears keep our hearts shuttered and locked.

God of full hearts: your love can change us from scared people to children of grace. You can weed doubts from our hearts and plant seeds of joy in their place. You can silence the panic of our souls with the peace Jesus offers to each of us. Transform us into Easter people, through the power of Jesus Christ, our risen Lord and Savior.

Scriptures (Scripture Verses are NSRV unless otherwise stated)

The Lesson from Acts 3:12-19

After healing a man unable to walk, Peter preaches to the people, describing how God's promises to Israel have been fulfilled in Jesus. Through the proclamation of Christ's death and resurrection, God is offering them forgiveness and restoration in Jesus' name.

¹²[Peter] addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

¹⁷"And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."




The Reading of Psalm 4

Peter might well have quoted this morning's Psalm to his audience at the temple. Two things are required to live, according to the author. One is to offer right sacrifice or, as we might better put it in our own time, to live a good and honorable life. The second is to trust God. To do the first without the second is a life of empty ritual where hope rests only in selfrighteousness. To do the second without the first – to trust God without a life of decency and just living – is to live an empty life of vain words and lies. We are reminded to live a life of righteous trust, and then we will live in abundant security.

- Answer my prayers, O True God, the righteous, who makes me right. I was hopelessly surrounded, and You rescued me. Once again hear me; hide me in Your favor; bring victory in defeat and hope in hopelessness.
- 2 How long will you sons of Adam steal my dignity, reduce my glory to shame? Why pine for the fruitless and dream a delusion?
- **3** Understand this: The Eternal One treats as special those like Him. The Eternal will answer my prayers and save me.
- 4 Think long; think hard. When you are angry, don't let it carry you into sin. When night comes, in calm be silent.
- **5** From this day forward, offer to God the right sacrifice from a heart made right by God. Entrust yourself to the Eternal.
- 6 Crowds of disheartened people ask, "Who can show us what is good?" Let Your brilliant face shine upon us, O Eternal One, that we may know the undeniable answer.
- **7** You have filled me with joy, and happiness has risen in my heart, great delight and unrivaled joy, even more than when bread abounds and wine flows freely.
- 8 Tonight I will sleep securely on a bed of peace because I trust You, You alone, O Eternal One, will keep me safe.
- C: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel Lesson from Luke 24:36b-48

In this account of an appearance after his resurrection, Jesus opens the minds of the disciples to understand him as Messiah. Jesus convinces them that he has been raised and sends them on a mission to proclaim the message of repentance and forgiveness.



P: Listen to the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Luke. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.** ^{36b}Jesus himself stood among [the disciples] and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have."

⁴⁰And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴²They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things."
